Whereas, The Greenville Civitan Club, eleven years ago upon the recommendation of Rachel Drake, supported by a committee of Dot Ray, Frankie Sloan and Mary Smith, adopted as a club service project the 44 residents of Ridgeview Community Care Home;

Whereas, The Greenville Civitan Club started with monthly Ridgeview birthday parties which consisted of home baked cakes, ice cream, personalized birthday presents such as watches and other jewelry for the honored birthday residents, along with bags of toiletries and boxes of candy treats for everyone;

Whereas, The Greenville Civitan Club also made the Christmas holiday wonderful each year for Ridgeview residents by purchasing gift bags of holiday favors distributed personally by Mr. and Mrs. Santa Clause, as well as, jackets for each woman and pullover sweaters for each man from Belk; souvenir pictures with Santa; holiday music; reading of the *Christmas Story*; games and fun activities;

Whereas, The Greenville Civitan Club, even in the midst of the pandemic continues to spread goodwill, holiday joy, and a much needed spirit of giving by coordinating and delivering Christmas gifts of jackets, sweaters and Christmas favors to Ridgeview residents for staff to distribute;
