Hon. Merl Code from REEM challenges us

On February 25, *Hon*. Merl F. Code, spoke about the Greenville Racial Equity +Economic Mobility Commission, also known as REEM. Hon. Code is part of the leadership and Co-Chair of REEM. With the Racial Equity Index that was commissioned by the United Way, glaring disparities within our community were made evident. REEM convened in 2020 around matters of racial inequities, social justice

and disparities in key areas that negatively impact the Black community in Greenville County. What started as a six-month program has since grown into five subcommittees each charged with recommending two or three tangible action-based sustainable strategies to address issues within those five committees: wealth & income, health & wellness, education, criminal justice, and community-wide learning. By collecting data and using that data leadership in our

county can initiate programs to ensure that all persons in Greenville County have access to the resources and a viable path out of poverty and to economic stability and growth. Hon. Code challenges our club to become better educated in what the status is for the citizens in Greenville County and how we can get involved for the betterment of all.
