Rev. Sean Dogan, another clergy club member reminded us that the Four Chaplains on the USS Dorchester when handing out life jackets, never asked what the benefactor's religion was. Instead the Four Chaplains freely gave their life preservers and followed the Scripture of Romans 12:10-Dr. Byron Battle, Club member & Guest Speaker *Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one anoth-er above yourselves.*" It was that tragic and heroic event that inspired Civitan International to adopt the first week of February

to honor all clergy in our communities. Dr. Byron, of the Tabernacle Baptist Church, eloquently spoke of the Scars We Wear- as proof of enduring and coming through hard

times. And while there are those that doubt until they can see and feel the wounds (referencing the disciple Thomas in the Book of John), blessed are those who do not see and still believe. Our event ended with a photo op and gift bags for each of our ministers. # **Advocacy for Families dealing with Disabilities**



At the February 24th meeting, the club was introduced to Ms. Tameka Diaz, a mother of three, homeschool teacher, and family advocate. In 2015, she became the full time caregiver to her daughter, Everly who was born with multiple disabilities and diagnosed with bilateral anophthalmia (a birth defect where a baby is born without one or both eyes). Since Everly's birth, she has received several diagnoses, Everly's genetic condition is extremely rare and the diagnosis is still unknown.

Tameka started "Through Everly's Eyes" to advocate and assist other families dealing with the medical issues and social barriers associated with blindness and other disabilities. Through the journey of

finding accessible venues for her daughter, there is either no support or lack of resources for the whole family: an example, there is only one school for the deaf & blind in the entire state of South Carolina, located in Spartanburg. She has pushed for her local government for accessibility of braille and sensory books in libraries, she learned to make adaptable toys, and she also consults and advises other caregivers, and organizes donations of medical supplies and equipment. Tameka thanked us for supporting the Ronald McDonald House, which she has used many times.

Due to Ms. Diaz persistence and dedication, all citizens have access to braille and sensory books at the Greenville County Libraries. Ms. Diaz is now promoting and hosting an event called Medical Moms Out for family caregivers. Through her advocacy, she has blazed a path in order for others to support and serve those in our community with disabilities.
